Minutes of the March 18, 2010 meeting in Wagner Hall.

**Attendees were:** Pip Piplani, President, Y. El-Naggar, Secretary, Bill Romoser, Fleming Heegaard, Fritz Trumbore, Glenn White, Richard Swanson, Ralph George, Mickey Taylor, Chris Fleet, George Rutter, and Guest, Mark Clay

The Minutes of the February 18, 2010 meeting were reviewed and approved, with the addition of Fleming Heegaard, as attending.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Pip Piplani. Jorie Martin's \$1,229.35 share of the Veterans' Day Dinner income has been disbursed per her request: \$500 toward the Defibrillator and \$729.35 for the refinishing of the Parish House floors. Treasurer's Report was approved.

The Defibrillator has been received and is planned to be located in the Table Closet of the Parish House. Training on it's use will be needed for at least one person who normally attends each event that uses the Parish House. Kay Largent, of the Warren Memorial Hospital, has agreed with Chuck Huber to provide at least the initial training. There will be recurring costs: Replacement of the battery every four years (about \$150) and a new pair of pads every 2 to 3 years (about \$80). It was moved and approved that these expenses be planned for inclusion in future Operating Budgets. There was some discussion about the need for a First Aid Kit in the Kitchen, but no decision was made.

Fritz Trumbore suggested a project to replace the Weber Hall sign. Fritz and Pip will look into it further.

Plans and individual responsibilities for the Chili Dinner (Saturday, 27 March, starting at 5:30), were settled.

The Lobster Dinner will be held on Saturday, May 8, with meals beginning at 4:30. Hamburgers and/or hot dogs will be included. The Youth Group and/or Native American Project (Jean Mary Taylor) will participate and share the profits. George Rutter is coordinator.

Richard Swanson reviewed initial plans for the Yard Sale (May 26 - 29). The need for protection of the newly re-finished floors was discussed.

Location of future meetings, including "Villa Guiseppi" was discussed. Pip will advise of the decision.

Fleming Heegaard reviewed and answered questions about his recent three month trip to the Republic of Mongolia, working with the U. S. Agency for International Development. He was primarily in the Capital, Ulan Bator. The trip was interesting (and exciting at times). An informative discussion followed.

The next Meeting will be on Thursday, April 15, location to be announced.
